Walking off the beaten path I collect small organisms that are uprooted or in fragments. I do not photograph my finds. I simply pick up an insect, snakeskin, plant or whatever, and take it directly into my darkroom. Instead of using a negative, I arrange the fragile material on a small square of glass and magnify the composition in the enlarger. Unexpected discovery can be found in the smallest bits and pieces.
